- 5. **COMPUTER LIFE:** Do I spend too much time there?
- 6. MINISTRY LIFE: Where can I give more?
- 7. FINANCIAL LIFE: How can I make things better?
- 8. **SOCIAL LIFE:** Do I have close friendships?
- 9. ATTITUDE: What has my attitude been lately?
- 10. CREATIVE LIFE: Am I living the dreams? Learning? Writing? Experiencing?
- 11. TRAVEL LIFE: How do I balance time away from home and church?
- 12. PHYSICAL LIFE: Am I taking care of my body?
